### CBSE scraps 41 unpopular subjects @ Library & Information one of the subject

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has decided to discontinue seven elective subjects such as philosophy and theatre studies, along with 34 vocational subjects for students of classes 11 and 12 from 2017-18 because of fewer takers every year.

The assessment scheme for the Class 10 board examination for schools offering vocational subjects as compulsory ones has also been remodeled.

Schools have been advised not to offer these subjects at the senior secondary level from the next academic session. However, students pursuing these subjects currently in Class 11 shall continue with them in Class 12 in 2017-18, states a circular issued by Manoj K Srivastava, joint secretary and in charge, academic training research and innovation, CBSE.

Academic electives, which have been scrapped at the senior secondary level, include creative Writing and Translation Studies, Human Rights and Gender Studies, Graphic Design, Library and Information Science and others.

The New Media Consortium (NMC), University of Applied Sciences (HTW) Chur, Technische Informations bibliothek (TIB), ETH Library, and the Association of College & Research Libraries (ACRL) are jointly releasing the NMC Horizon Report > 2017 Library Edition at the ACRL 2017 Conference. This is the third edition of the NMC Horizon Report that explores the realm of academic and research libraries in a global context.

This report describes annual findings from the NMC Horizon Project, a 15-year-old ongoing research project designed to identify and describe emerging technologies poised to influence learning, teaching, and creative inquiry. Six key trends, six significant challenges, and six important developments in educational technology are placed directly in the context of their likely impact on the core missions of academic and research libraries.

The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation on Thursday unveiled Gates Open Research, an open-access publishing platform designed exclusively for the foundation's grant recipients. The platform, which was developed by F1000 and is scheduled to launch in the third quarter of 2017, gives grant recipients

another option for where to publish their work that complies with the foundation's open-access requirements. The requirements went into effect Jan. 1 and requires recipients to publish their research and data in an open-access journal or repository. The foundation has also created Chronos, a service that aggregates information about scholarly journals to help recipients find eligible journals

# Words have to wait for the trees in a Norwegian wood to turn into pages

Some will never know if their books were appreciated by readers, many of whom aren't born yet. Every year for 100 years, a different author will contribute to the "Future Library", a collection of works to be published only in the next century.

So far, 1,000 Norwegian spruces planted three years ago are the only visible sign of this internationally and stylistically diverse project, each little shrub decorated with a red ribbon in a modest clearing in a forest on the outskirts of Oslo.

Once they reach 100 years old, in 2114,

the trees will be chopped down and used to make paper for anthologies compiling the works of the invited writers.

Canadian author Margaret Atwood was the first one asked to join the initiative in 2015, followed by English novelist David Mitchell in 2016. This year Icelandic poet Sjon submitted his manuscript — one, his contemporaries will, in all likelihood, never read.

### Regulatory overhaul for teacher training colleges

The business of teacher education is set for a clean-up. And some would say long overdue.

The blueprint being wielded by the apex regulator, the National Council For Teacher Education (NCTE), promises drastic action against errant institutions—nearly 3,000 teacher education colleges may be barred from admitting fresh students from the next academic year. Simultaneously, by January next year, NCTE will put out a ranking of the top 100 teacher training institutes.

#### A school without textbooks

We need to nurture skills, encourage children to engage with environment

When in 1999 we started a school without prescribed textbooks, the reactions ranged from mild surprise and amusement to anxiety, even shock and indignation. A school without textbooks? How would children learn? Yet, after 18

years, our data shows that these children are faring as well, and in many cases even better, than their counterparts who studied in schools with prescribed textbooks. From kindergarten to Class 10, children at the Mahatma Gandhi International School (a PPP with the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation) learnt through real life projects that they voted for or proposed and then prepared for their exams in grades 11 and 12.
