Open Book: 'No rhyme or reason' on ebook prices :-



I work at a small university in the UK, with correspondingly small library budgets.

In the last few months I've noticed some ebook prices had shot up – by up to five times the original price, in some cases.

Some of the books were now priced at up to \pounds 1,000, which was bad enough, and one particular contract effectively had an expiry date – so that you might have to pay a huge amount for an ebook and then buy it again the following year. I really don't know where that kind of thinking comes from. Librarians don't generally know how much other universities are paying for they resources; it's a very murky situation, and it's impossible to know how the publishers have worked out their prices for each institution...
