A Workshop on "Exchange & Explore for School Librarians" was held at the C.N. Vidhyalay.

A Workshop for the "International Digital Story Writing Competition" for Library Professionals from all over South Asia was conducted. Since most of these Webinars were online, there were a large number of participants from all over India and even from abroad.

An online webinar on the topic "Accessing and Using Open-Access Resources" was organized by ADINET on 23rd October 2021. The webinar session was delivered by Ms Asha Desai (Asst. Librarian, Vikram Sarabhai Library, IIM Ahmedabad). The aim of this webinar was to acquaint library professionals with the latest Open Access Resources and their use in educational institutions and libraries.

At the beginning of the webinar, Dr Shailesh Yagnik (Library Consultant at KEIC, MICA) introduced the webinar topic. He explained the history of Open-Access movements and initiatives. He said that the movement of Open Access was started in the year 1942 by Robert King Merton - the American sociologist, who stated that "each researcher must contribute to the 'common pot' and give up the intellectual property right to allow knowledge to move forward". He also explained that the first open-access journal "The New Horizon in Adult Education" was introduced in 1987 and in 1991, The Repository of Physics Research Papers.

The webinar session speaker was introduced by Mr Viral Navik (Sr. Professional Asst., Vikram Sarabhai Library, IIM Ahmedabad).

The resource person Ms Desai covered all the major aspects of this subject. To begin with she first explained the history of Open Access. The Budapest Open Access Initiative had defined **Open Access** (in the year 2002), and Bethesda Statement on Open Access Publishing was in 2003 for encouraging faculty and grant recipients of signing institutions to utilize the instrument of OA publishing.

The main objective of using open-access resourcess because the prices of Journals and other resources have been increasing day by day. The online academic Journal has risen by 273% between 1985 to 2004. Disciplines like physics and chemistry journals rose by more than 600% (Edlin and Rubinfeld, 2004).

The resource person explained the various Open Access licenses and their usages. Ms Asha has mentioned the various directories of Open Access materials, e.g. DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals) and DOAB (Directory of Open Access Books), different OA platforms – SSRN, PubMed, BioMad Central, arXiv and RePEc for subjects like biomedical, technology, computer science, statistics, finance and economics. She also explained the various OA India Centric Data sources - Census Digital library, ICSSR, Open Govt. Data, RBI data and Mospi (Ministry of Statistics and Program Implementation) and Portals which provide global data – World Bank, IMF, UN data, WHO and UNCTD.

Importantly she very clearly explained various OA research data platforms Dryad Digital Repository, figshare, Harvard Dataverse Network, Kaggle, Open Science Framework and Zenodo, which will be very useful for librarians to support research activities. Lastly, she coved the OA for schools -<u>https://www.oercommons.org/</u> and <u>https://prat</u> <u>hamopenschool.org/</u>.

Finally, Ms Asha answered all the questions by the participants. The entire webinar session was very informative, and participants really appreciated this session and ADINET initiatives.

The Programme was received well by the library professionals across the country. Total 88 professionals registered for the workshop. The participants included library professionals from Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Odisha, Gujarat, Faridabad, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, karnataka, Assam, Haryana, Rajasthan, New Delhi and Punjab.

The session was conducted by Mr. Bhavesh Patel, Senior Library Professional, Vikram Sarabhai Library, IIM Ahmedabad. Dr. Sheetal Tank. Librarian, Atmiya University and Coordinator-ADINET SIG UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES the workshop. organized Welcome address was delivered by Mrs. Rhoda Bharucha, Hon. Director, ADINET. The session in detail covered Word Press, which is an Open Source Software, which may be used to create a beautiful website or blog. It is also known as Content Management Software (CMS). He began with types of websites, Installation of Word Press, its basic features, implementing of various Plugins, installation of theme and Customization, Uploading on the live server for public access and Google Analytics Integration for checking live tracking.

- (d) Other ways to create library website




Following are some of the feedbacks received from the participants, which were quite motivating for the organizer to organize many more such technical skill development session in future.






At the end of her presentation she tried to answer the queries poised by the participants. Few of the questions are listed below.

International Workshop for School Librarians on "Fostering the next generation authors and helping people stay safe from COVID-19"

The South Asia Chapter of the Association for Information Science & Technology (ASIS&T) in collaboration with the School Library Association (India) organized an international workshop for school librarians on "Fostering the next generation authors and helping people stay safe from COVID-19" in collaboration with promotional partnership from the Special Interest Group on School Libraries of ADINET, Bangladesh Shishu Academy and the School Library Association, Pakistan on 11th December 2021 from 5:00 to 6:00 pm. The keynote speakers for the event were Dr. Sam Chu, Associate Professor, School of Education, The University of Hong Kong, Ms. Helen Chan, Vice-Chair, Academy 22 for all Education and Dr. Bhakti Gala, Assistant Professor, School of Library and Information Science, Central University of Gujarat. The event was attended by more than 100 participants from India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Pakistan and Hong Kong.





The event began with a brief welcome from Ms. Madhu Bhargava, President, and S L Faisal, Secretary, School Library Association (India). Dr. Bhakti Gala, Principal Investigator for the ASIS&T South Asia Chapter Special Project on "Dealing with COVID-19 and saving people's lives in South Asia (SA) areas & beyond - A health informatics promotion project" introduced the project details and the project team members from different South Asian countries. Dr. Gala gave an overview about the purpose behind organizing the International Digital Storytelling Competition. To capture the narrative of students during these pandemic times, the project in collaboration with Academy 22 for all Educationhas organized this global competition for students from age group 5 onwards to 18 years. Dr. Sam Chu shared their experiences of holding the Asian Digital Storytelling previously and explained the Reading Battle designed by them. He further shared that his research in this area has proved that digital storytelling can help develop student's writing, reading, and speaking abilities. The third speaker, Ms. Helen Chan spoke about the 20+ free workshops organized from 1stJanuary onwards for school students. Ms. Helen shared videos of award winners from the previous competitions.

Ms. Helen further described the details of the competition. The broad theme of this competition is "Al& Health" and the narrow theme of the competition is "COVID-19: Imagine, Create & Share"". To prepare students to participate in this competition, ten workshops have been organized for the primary students and ten workshops for the secondary students. Celebrated authors, artists and experts from different South Asian countries have been invited to conduct these workshops. The titles of the workshops range from How to write a creative story, how to create a digital story, how to write a story on

Al, Techniques of digital art creation, how to translate your story from one language to another among many others. There are 10 special awards for winners from the South Asia Region.

The concluding session included special words of support from Mr. Ruwan Gamage, Chair, South Asia Chapter (ASIS&), the promotional partners represented by Ms. Rhoda Bharucha, Honorary Director, ADINET, Ms.RazinaAlam, Director, Bangladesh Shishu Academy and Mr. Nooruddin Merchant, Director, School Libraries Association, Pakistan. The vote of thanks was given by SLA (India) Team members Ishrat Parveen, MamtaDeshwal and Darshana Gopinath.
